

DECLARATION OF MINIMUM ENVIRONMENTAL AND DNSH CRITERIA CONFORMITY

- substances, whether in their pure state or in mixtures or articles, listed in Annex I or II to Regulation (EC) 1005/2009 of the European Parliament and of the Council;
- substances, whether in their pure state or in mixtures or articles, listed in Annex II to Directive 2011/65/UE of the European Parliament and of the Council, except where full compliance with Article 4, Paragraph 1, of that Directive is guaranteed;
- substances, whether in their pure state or in mixtures or articles, listed in Annex XVII to Regulation (EC) 1907/2006 of the European Parliament and of the Council, except where full compliance with the provisions set out in that Annex is ensured;
- substances, whether in their pure state or in mixtures or articles, that meet the criteria set out in Article 57 of Regulation (EC) 1907/2006 and identified pursuant to Article 59, Paragraph 1, of that Regulation, except where their use is deemed essential for society;
- other substances, whether in their pure state or in mixtures or articles, that meet the criteria set out in Article 57 of Regulation (EC) 1907/2006, except where their use is deemed essential for society.
